





Reviewed phonic elements *n, a, p, m, s, t, o, d, h*


Story words *fall flat*

Reviewed high-frequency words *a, and, cannot, get, has, I, is, off, on, run, the, they, to*



Special considerations plural ending *-s*;

A flat hat is not the fad."





The hat is on Pam.

The fat hat falls off.




“The hat is not fat,” said Pam.
