Words with new phonic element *scram, scrap, splat, splint, sprig, sprint, strap, stress, strip, strut*

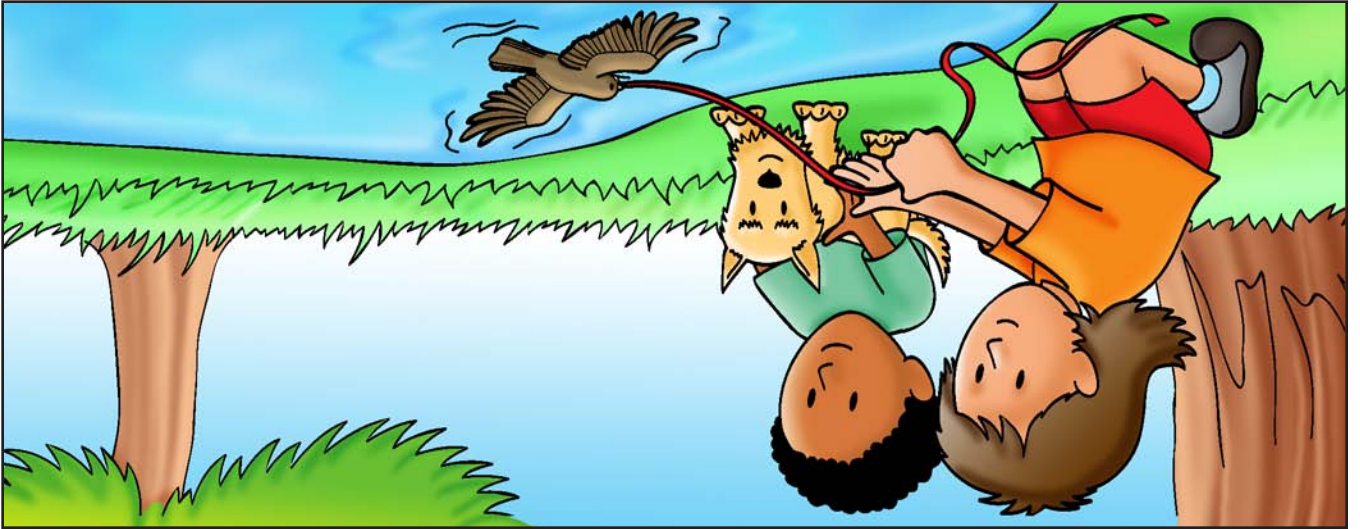
Reviewed phonic elements initial and final blends;

The kid yanked and yanked.



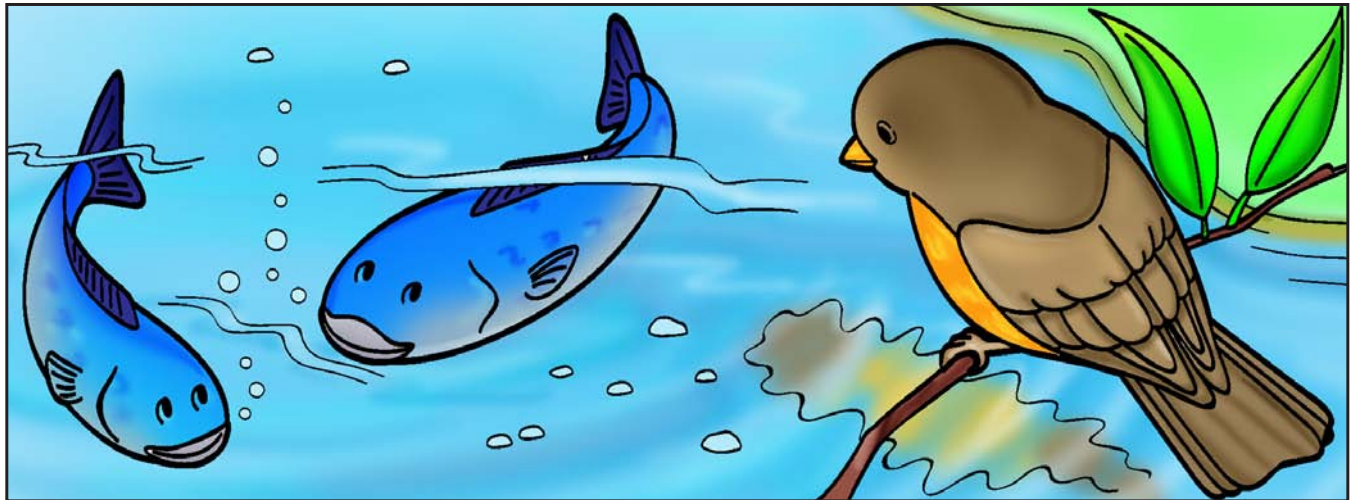
It was spring and the sun was out.
