whistling from over the water.



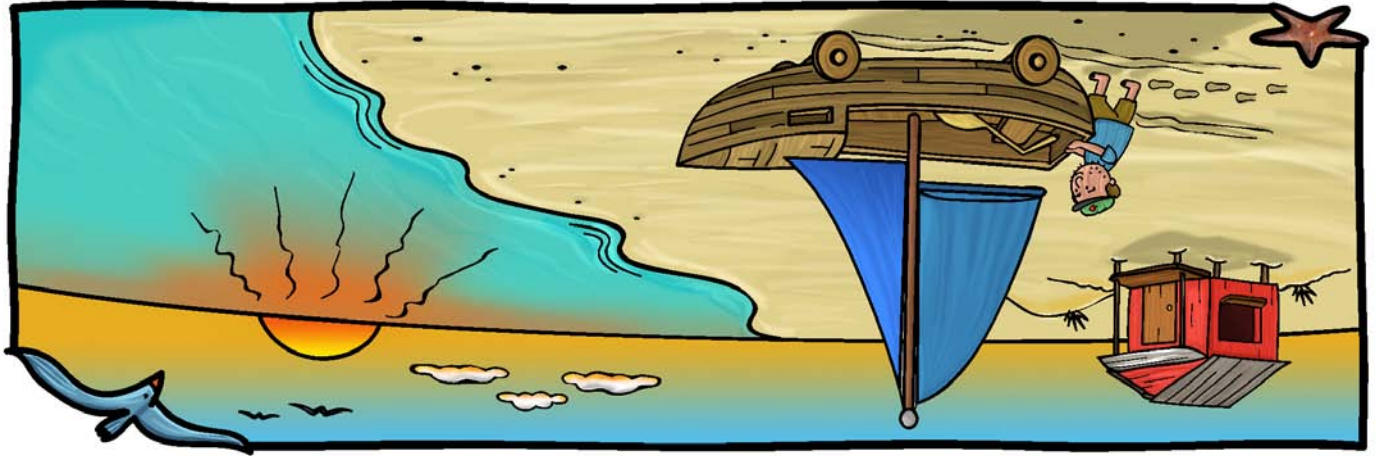
Whisker Bill lived in a hut next to the water.
