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




Marking R-Controlled Syllables







Birthday Surprise



Connect The Four Words



Materials: Game board, word cards for players 1 and 2, cut out and shuffled

Preparation: Place each set of word cards in an envelope after they are shuffled. There is one set of cards for each player.

Directions

1. Decide who will go first.
2. On a turn, WITHOUT LOOKING, a player will draw a card from their envelope. Read the word out loud. Place the card on an open space with the same vowel sound.
3. Tip: Players are trying to block their opponent from connecting four words. Think about how this can be done as you take your turn on the game board.
4. Keep taking turns until someone can connect four of the words on the game board, OR, can no longer play the game.
5. If a player reads a word and there is no open space on the board, they lose their turn. They should return the card to their envelope.





Materials: One set of word cards per player, (pages 10-12) One Orbit The Stars game board, a paper clip and pencil for a spinner, one laminated star board per player, dry erase markers and erasers.


To Play:

1. On a turn, a player spins the spinner. (Line the spinner up on the black dot on the rocket ship.)
2. When they land on a space, the player's opponent will need to choose one card. The player will read, spell and write the word on the road with a dry erase marker. Then, circle the r-control syllable. Earn one star point for each word spelled correctly.
3. Repeat directions 1-3 for the next player.
4. Land on a star and earn one star point. Land on an astronaut and gain two points. Land on an alien and lose one point.
5. The person with the most star points at the end wins the game!


