# Escape The Cyclops' Cave



**Skill:** Practice sorting and writing words with Y as long or short I.


**Materials:** Dry erase board, markers and eraser, one set of word cards per player, cut apart (double-side to the cards with Cyclops on the front), one laminated Cyclops Cave Maze per player, One laminated Cyclops Game Board, dry erase markers and erasers

## How To Play:

1. Both players will shuffle their deck very well and place them picture side up in front of them.
2. On a turn: Both players flip a card over and place them onto the brown rectangles on the game board and read them out loud.
3. Try to make a match. A match is when both cards have the same vowel sound for Y. If players make a match, they may enter the Cyclops' cave maze starting with Odysseus.
4. On a match, each player will trace their way into the first empty rectangle and write the word they made a match with into the rectangle. Be sure players spell the word out loud as they write it.
5. Keep flipping cards to make matches Unmatched cards go into a used pile. Every time a match is made, players can advance further into the cave maze to the next empty rectangle and fill in more words.
6. The goal is to fill every empty rectangle with a word and make it out of the cave maze, escaping Cyclops.




