Materials: Dry erase board, markers and eraser, one set of sentence strips with clues, cut apart, one laminated bingo board per player (there are two versions), dry erase markers and erasers

How To Play:

1. Decide who will go first.
2. On a turn, the first player takes one sentence strip out and reads the clue.
3. Players have to find a word on their board that fits the description on the clue.
4. When they find the word on the board, players may cross out the word with a marker.
5. The next player will follow step 2.
6. Keep playing until one person earns a BINGO, which is five words marked off in any column.
7. The league photo is a free space.


