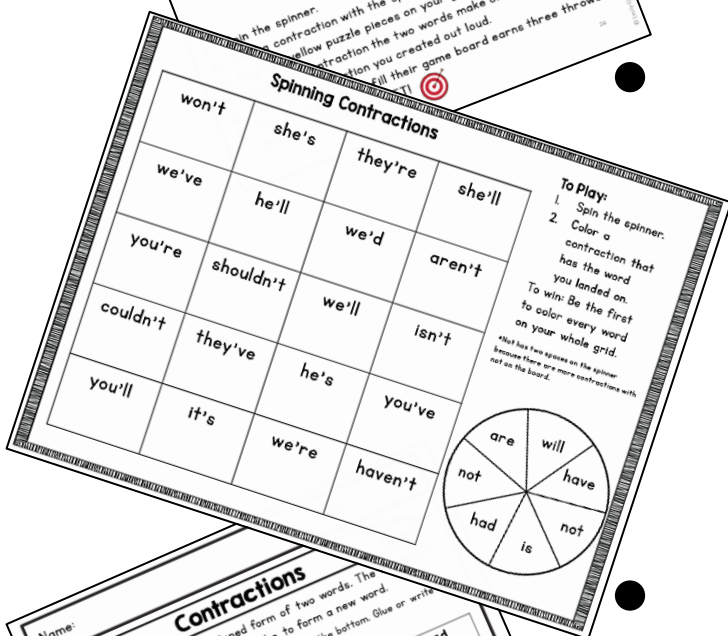




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Dear Educator,

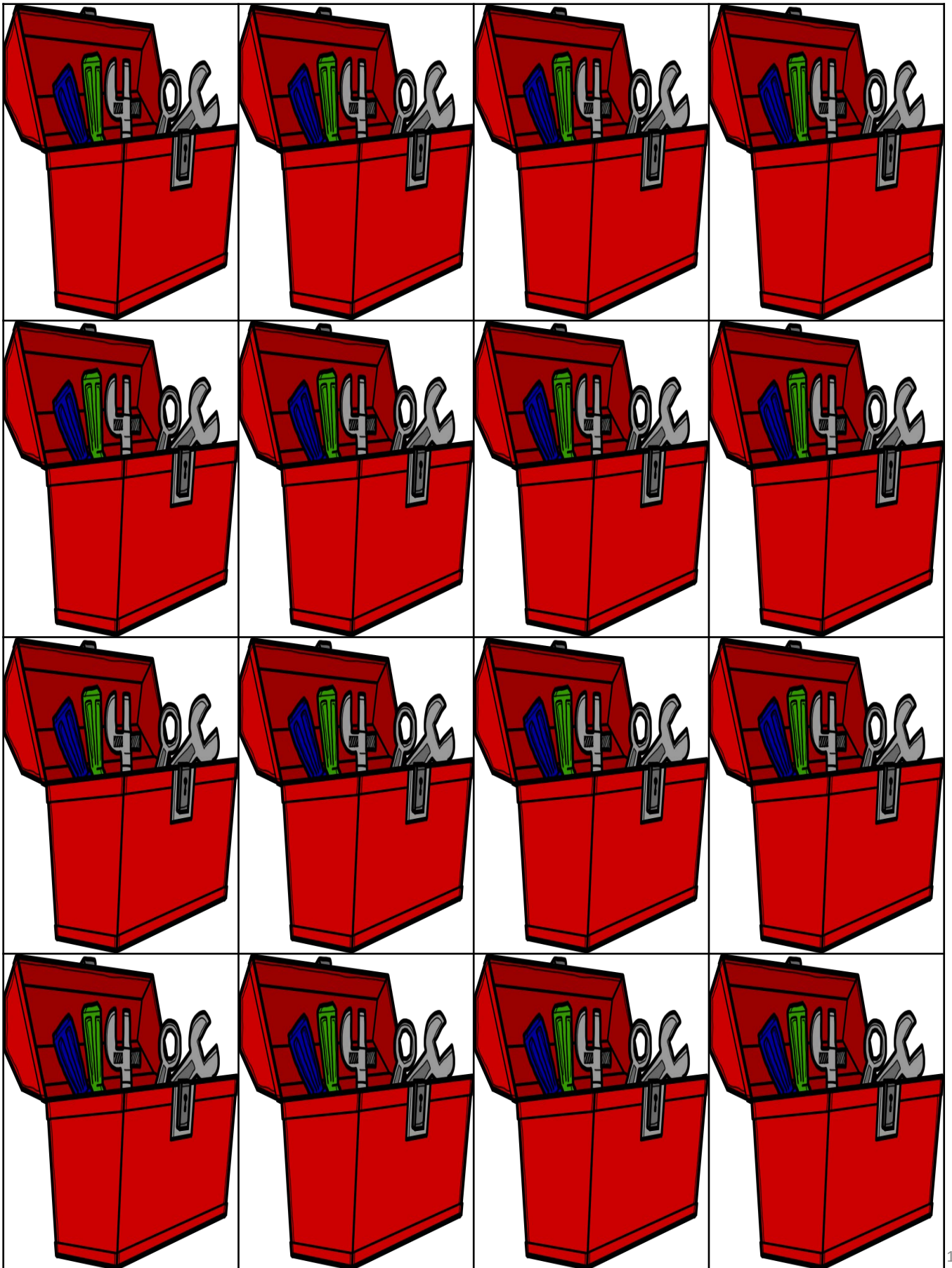

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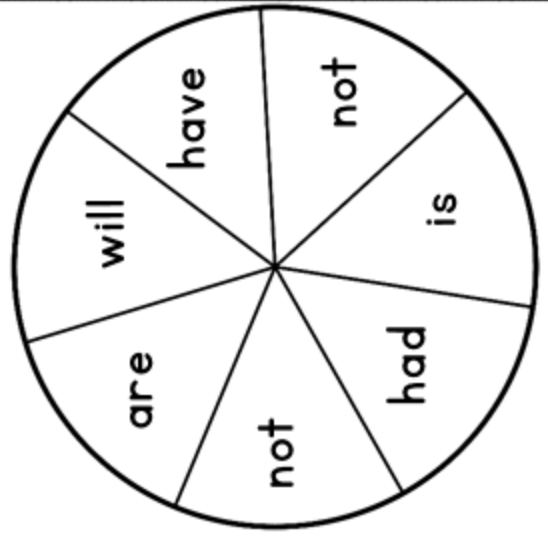
# Spinning Contractions

## To Play:

1. Spin the spinner.
2. Color a contraction that has the word you landed on.

To win: Be the first to color every word on your whole grid.

\*Not has two spaces on the spinner because there are more contractions with not on the board.

# Connect The Four Contractions



**Materials:** Game board, contraction cards for players 1 and 2, cut out and shuffled

**Preparation:** Place each set of contraction cards in an envelope after they are shuffled. There is one set of cards for each player.

## Directions

1. Decide who will go first.
2. On a turn, **WITHOUT LOOKING**, a player will draw a card from their envelope. Read the contraction out loud. Place the card on an open space that has that word in your contraction.
3. Tip: Players are trying to block their opponent from connecting four contractions. Think about how this can be done as you take your turn on the game board.
4. Keep taking turns until someone can connect four of the contractions on the game board, **OR**, can no longer play the game.
5. If a player draws a contraction card and there is no open space on the board, they lose a turn. They should return the card to their envelope.

## Game Preparation

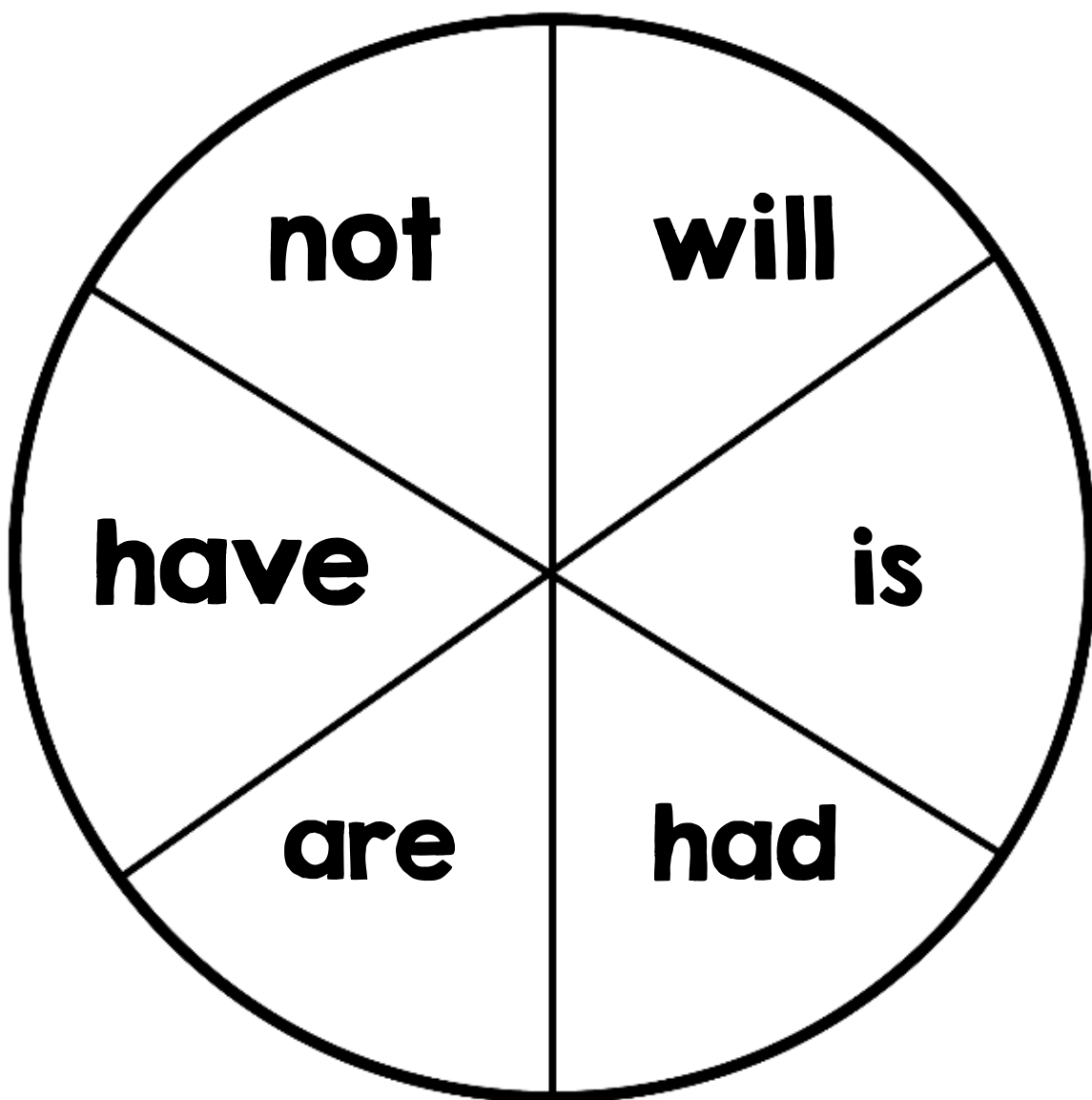
1. Laminate the target and spinner template pages.
2. Copy yellow contraction card puzzle pieces on cardstock and cut apart.
3. Use a squishy ball, foam ball or suction targets for aiming at the target when a child wins a game.
4. Give one game board to each player.
5. Students will each have their own set of puzzle pieces.
6. Have students place their game board and spread out their puzzle pieces. Place the spinner template between the players. Use pencil and paperclip for a spinner. NOTE: Each space on the spinner has three different options to make contractions.
7. Game directions are on the spinner template.

6. The first person to fill their game board earns three throws to try and HIT THE TARGET!

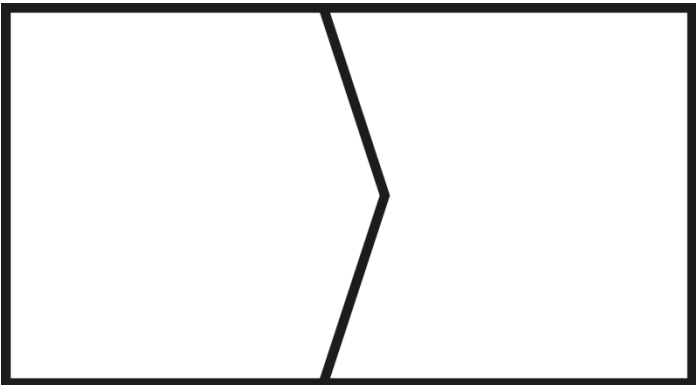
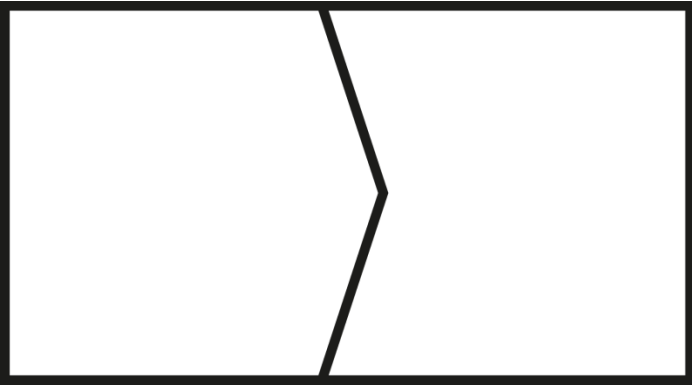
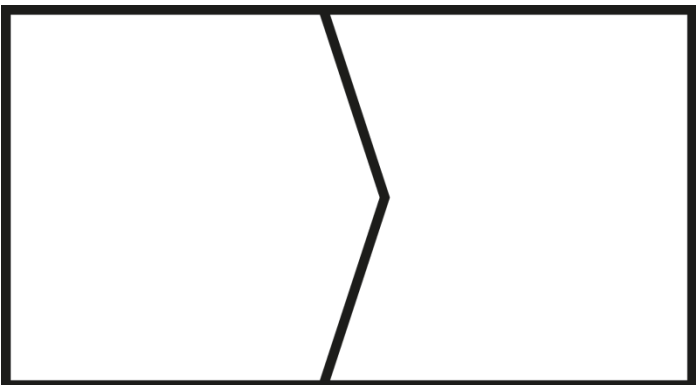
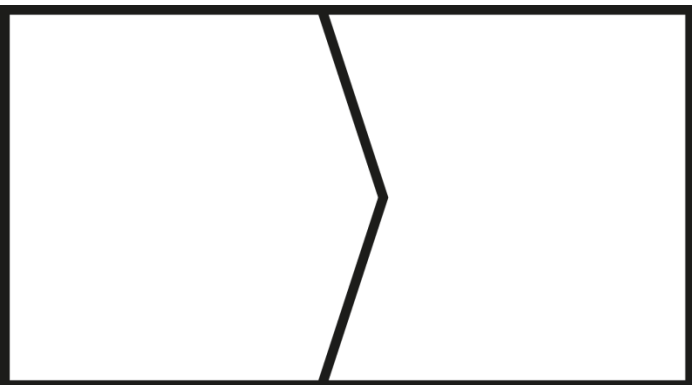
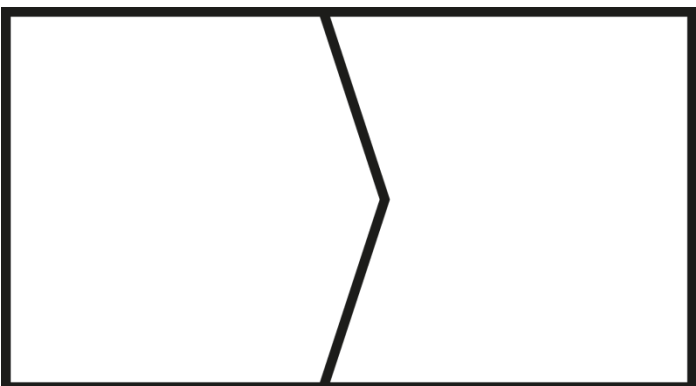
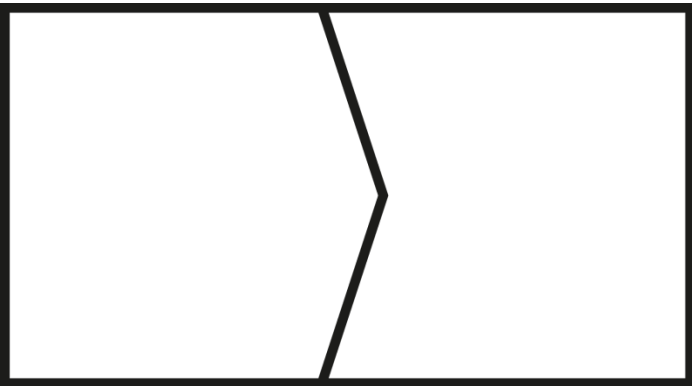
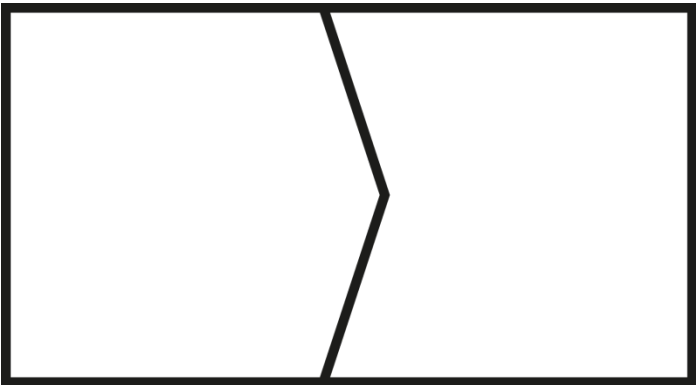
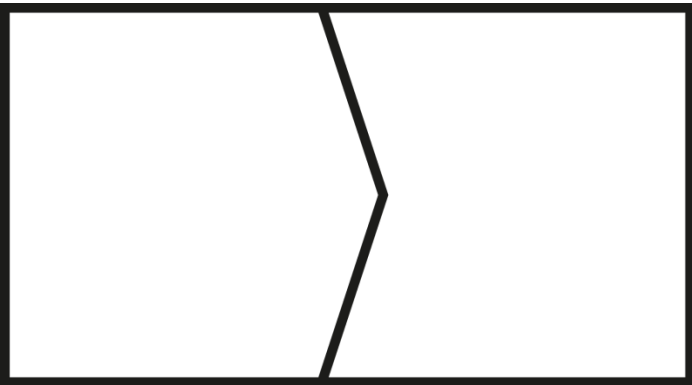
