



Use the writing activity or fact poster as an culminating activity.



Beneficial Insects Fact File



Fast facts:

- There are over a million known insects on the planet.
- They make up 75% of the animal kingdom.
- Beneficial insects help our planet's ecosystem.

Do you think all insects are pests? Well think again. Only a very small portion, or part of our planet's insect population is really harmful. The rest are called beneficial insects. Beneficial, or helpful, means these critters have very important jobs. They keep our planet healthy. Without them, there may be serious problems.


Some insects help with pollination, like bees. Without bees many flowers and fruits wouldn't grow. Others are natural garden protectors, like ladybugs. They eat aphids, small insects that like to eat through your vegetable garden. Worms help decompose or break down natural materials in our backyard, which helps to create rich soil.

Take some time in your backyard or local park to stop and observe these helpful insects. Provide a safe environment for them by not spraying pesticides, or harmful chemicals which destroy them. You'll find out these creatures really are beneficial!

I have four stages in my life cycle as a butterfly: egg, larva, chrysalis and butterfly. I'm attracted to certain plants growing in your backyard.



I love dark, damp places in your backyard. Feasting on fruits and vegetables makes me a vegetarian. Did you know I can live up to 15-20 years?


