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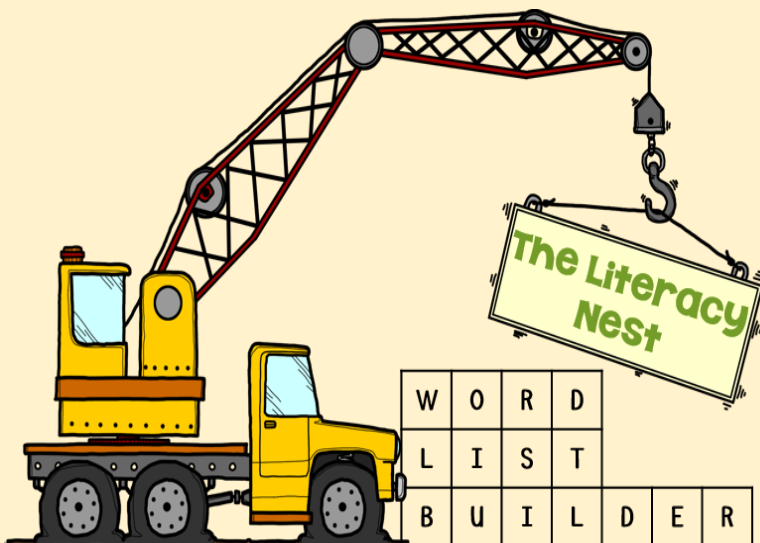

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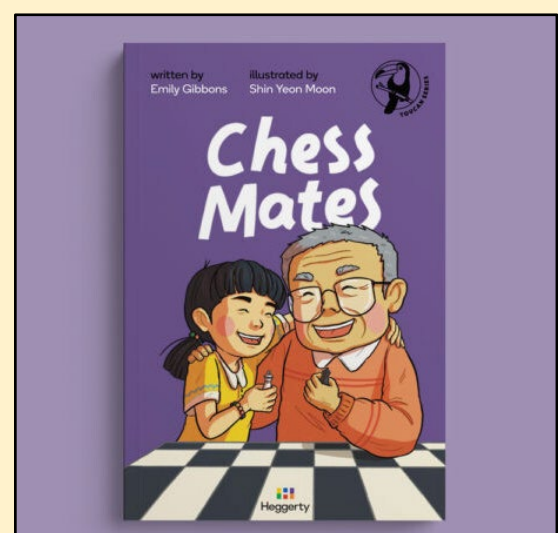
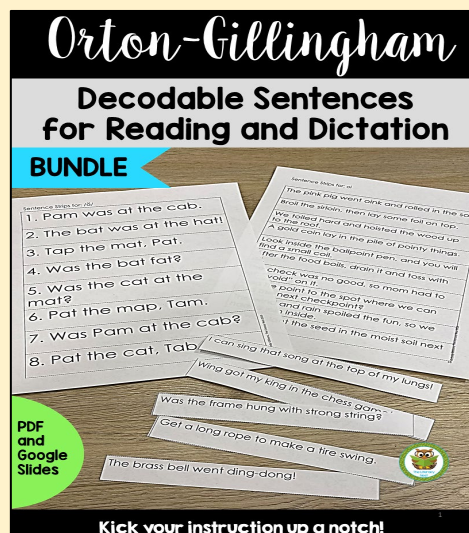

LEVEL TWO

- **IMPORTANT NOTE:** Level Two is an important one. It's about carrying over the skills and concepts learned in Level One and building on them. The majority of new content in Level Two will address vowel teams, r-controlled vowels, spelling generalizations, an introduction to suffixes and syllable division.
- **A word of caution-** Just because you see back to back pages of vowel teams, does not mean you should teach them one after the other in that order. Rather, it is helpful to space them out to avoid confusion. This is especially helpful for vowels teams like EE/EA, because there is no spelling generalization for those two vowel teams.
- **Vocabulary:** Level Two is the perfect opportunity to introduce homophones. You will find there are many to match the skills in this level! Create posters or have students draw pictures showing the meanings and spellings of homophone pairs or triplets.
- **Learned Words:** All words from Level One will be used in addition to the new ones recorded in the upper right corner of each passage.

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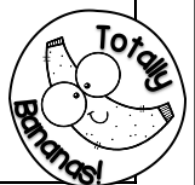
